From a letter by Ken Gagnon, manager Public Works, Guelph-Eramosa Township—

The Public Works Department 2007 draft Ten Year Roads Capital Plan would see 5.2 million dollars expended over the next ten (10) years to up-grade four (4) roads totaling 18.1 km in length, including: Milton/Eramosa Townline from Hwy 7 to Eden Mills

The Barden Street project is of limited scope because the need to resurface the street arose due to maintenance operations and is not a planned capital up-grade. Unfortunately, it does not include traffic calming measures. The Public Works Department is trying to develop a speed hump policy which will include a warrant process for their installation. I do not foresee installation of Speed Humps or Bumps on any road within Guelph/Eramosa until the Public Works Department has had sufficient time to develop a policy and warrant for presentation and adoption by Council.
