The hall is co-owned by The Eden Mills and District Community Club (EMDCC) and the Township of Guelph-Eramosa (GET), each with 50%. EMDCC takes care of operating the hall and paying all the bills, with funds raised thru rentals and special events. GET plows the parking lot in the winter, and occasionally provides grants for special projects, for example the recent kitchen/bar renovation.
